

Timeless Truths from the Oldest Voices

Return to the Lord - Hezekiah

This month we are completing our multi-year study of Old Testament characters and what they can offer us today. This has been an enjoyable exercise in delving into the more obscure part of our Bible and looking at characters both familiar and unknown. We end this study with an appropriate message to our nation and a fabulous example of reform and thorough dedication — Hezekiah.

You would have NEVER thought Hezekiah was going to be one of the most godly, impactful kings of Judah just from his ancestry! He was the son of Ahaz, the king that threw a couple of his sons into the fire (2 Chron. 28:3) to dedicate his house! Think about it, Hezekiah lost brothers needlessly as his daddy practiced pagan rituals thinking they would protect him and increase his riches. Maybe I shouldn't be so surprised at the overwhelming level of reform that Hezekiah orchestrated during his reign. But he was also the father to

Manasseh, who rebuilt the high places, offered sacrifices to idols, and seduced all of Judah to commit more evil than all the nations around them (33:9).

The Scripture covers the life of Hezekiah in multiple places, 2 Kings 18-20, 2 Chronicles 29-32, and Isaiah 36-39, a whopping 11 chapters, marking one of the most detailed descriptions of any king - second only to David. Hezekiah "undid" all that his father had done right from the start, beginning in the first year of his reign by re-opening the doors of the Temple and cleaning up the House of God, restoring worship, sanctifying the Levites, and turning the people's attention back toward God (2 Chron. 29:3-6). His reforms were extensive and thorough, painful and expensive, but necessary to avoid what happened to their brethren just north of them -Sennacherib invaded Israel and completely destroyed Samaria (year 722 B.C.). Sennacherib wasn't through either. He threatened Hezekiah, if an alliance wasn't granted. He basically told Hezekiah, "Your God didn't protect Israel, why would you and all of Judah trust in that God again? Better work with me instead." Hezekiah

prayed, sought the Lord, and God protected Judah, making Sennacherib eat his own words! I love that!

The other reforms of Hezekiah make up a lengthy list. He cleansed and prepared all the altars for sacrifice and Temple worship. He returned the people to the Levitical offerings (sin, trespass, peace, whole burnt, and thank offerings), all back in the Temple, instructing the priests and the Levites to perform everything exactly as the Lord had commanded them. He returned music, singing, the bowing of heads in worship in the Temple, and he brought back the practice of the Passover. There was rejoicing, the entire congregation was giving of tithes and gifts, and there was an abundance. No one lacked anything. It was like the days of Solomon! (31:10) (NOTE: When the people gave unselfishly, the Lord blessed everyone! What remained after everyone had plenty was this great abundance! Hmmmmmm.)

He also removed a once very prominent article that had historic value – the Nehushtan, (2 Kings 18:4) translated,



Date: Thursday, February 21, 2019 Time: 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM





Return to the Lord -Hezekah

"that bronze thing." This was the very bronze pole with the serpent fashioned around it that Moses commanded all the "snake-bit Jews" to gaze upon, so they might be healed (Num. 21:5-9), a symbol still used today by the medical profession. Centuries after this event, the Jews were using it for some kind of superstitious activity, burning incense to it and such. It was an icon, a memory stick that pointed to Moses and Hezekiah took it from them and broke it into pieces because they profaned it! What a gutsy call! Now that's the kind of leadership we could use today!

Of course, not everyone was "on board," as it states in 2 Chronicles 30:10. Some of the people laughed and mocked them as the mantra from Hezekiah was announced. "Return to the Lord!" But the Bible states that, "The hand of God was on Judah to give them singleness of heart to

obey the command of the king reforms of Josiah, but Josiah and the leaders, at the word of only imitated Hezekiah. the Lord" (v. 12). Notice the people obeyed their leadership and their leadership followed the word of the Lord. This is such a success story of an earth-shaking magnitude! To go from "about to be destroyed by an outside enemy," to "more prosperous than your houses can contain" is a scenario that our families. churches, communities, and nation would love to experience! The key to this success story is the "idea" - RETURN TO THE LORD!

This was the theme of all of Hezekiah's reforms. He had experienced the other side. the unfulfilled promises of an anti-biblical worldview. He had seen it kill two of his brothers. corrupt his country, and place the entire nation in perilous jeopardy. He had heard of the life and devotion of David, a name linked to him in 2 Kings and 2 Chronicles when they both described how he led. He observed the antithesis of 'Davidic obedience' in his own family and made the obvious conclusion - we must RETURN TO THE LORD! And return, he did!

No other king did as much as Hezekiah did in total reform. Many pastors look at the

Hezekiah had no example from which to follow. No one had ever bucked the system like this, to not just go against the status quo, but break down every vestige of cultural artifacts connected to idolatry. Hezekiah was the original "drain the swamp" leader, to steal a modern term, and he took down every abomination, every high place, and every wooden stick that once pointed to the dead god of Baal. He stood up to the very king that destroyed Israel, the Northern Kingdom, with grit and confidence. He was also the one that motivated God to move the sundial back 10 degrees to prove that he would heal Hezekiah of his illness and let him live.

He wasn't perfect. None of us are, but he displayed a perception of understanding regarding the main principle a return to the worship and obedience of Almighty God. This flesh and blood example is exactly what we are needing in our churches today.

We must return! Our clock is also ticking. . .


