

Timeless Truths from the Oldest Voices

This month we continue our study of characters from the Old Testament. We have already looked at the first couple, Adam and Eve, Abel and Enoch. Now let's turn our attention to a very popular character that has much to offer us in discipline, devotion, and integrity.

-The Lesson from Noah - "Godly Fear and Faith"

Genesis 6-9; Hebrews 11:7; 2 Peter 2:5

Who hasn't heard of Noah? His name and the events surrounding him are actually one of the most notable in world history. The story of the flood, a family of eight surviving, and even the name, "Noah," are known in practically every civilization, both recent and ancient. For instance, the Mesopotamians, Egyptians, Chinese, and Greeks all have the story of Noah in their primordial times. Though modern, secular historians scoff at the mere mention of his name when considered as fact, they cannot deny the hundreds of cultures all over the world that have a "Noah's flood" legend or story in their historical records. Science mocks the mention of a worldwide flood to their own embarrassment as the scars, fossils, and mountains of evidence of the Noachian Deluge "floods" every continent and ocean on our globe. Noah and his story are more than just legendary, and for good reason. It really happened! Although I'd love to continue with the scientific evidence of Noah's real life event, my purpose for this article keeps me from going down this path.

In the Genesis record, Noah embarks on an assignment that is somewhat overwhelming to grasp. He is commissioned by God to build a ship with three levels that, by today's illustration, would not fit on a regulation football field (approximately 450 by 75 feet), and he built it nowhere near water. This ship was literally the salvation for all mankind and for all the land animals that now cover the face of the earth, because everything else, and we are talking about quite a huge list, was destroyed by the flood. All those living things that perished in that flood became our gasoline, heating oil, and coal. This is very tragic when you think of the loss of life for both man and beast. But you see, the flood is as much about God's judgment and wrath towards sin as it is about saving the family of Noah and the animals. Noah was singled out as a man that found "grace" with

God (Gen. 6:8). What characteristic made Noah that special? What made him different? It says that he "walked with God" (Gen.6: 9), a reference that we studied earlier about the man, Enoch. Hebrews says it most clearly, Noah "was moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household" (11:7). Did you catch that? The motivation of his incredible unselfish life and toilsome labor was godly fear!

In that same verse as above, there is another statement about Noah that bears study. It states Noah "became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith." Noah demonstrated the unique characteristic that God seeks from us - righteousness which is according to faith! THIS is what God saw in Noah that set him apart. Notice his faith was in action. This is faith that builds an impressively huge ship, an ark that can hold samples of all land animals and a family of 8, along with their food source, for almost a year. This is the kind of faith that makes a humble man a "preacher of righteousness" (2 Peter 2:5) when everyone else thinks you are totally crazy, and they reject your message of God's judgment outright. It is beyond the simple, "I-believe-in-God" faith. What made this faith so real, so supernatural? Only godly fear can demonstrate itself through living faith. James tells us, "Faith without works is dead" (James 2:20). The spark that brings faith to life is godly fear. This type of fear is the realization that God is God, and you are not, and because of that, He is the Master of your life and

Noah was given a truly impossible task. Now let's just think about this. Here is Noah, tasked with the gruesome, overwhelming job of building an ark for the survival of his family and all the land animals. He has demonstrated godly fear and living faith. Did any of his peers demonstrate such character? You would think that God could have allowed Noah to live a peaceable, carefree, unencumbered life, free from difficult work and horrific circumstances because he found favor, or grace, in God's sight, or because his relationship was so close with the Lord. Genesis tells us that he was "a just man, perfect in his generations" (Gen. 6:9). Of course this does not mean that Noah did not have any sin, it was a comparison that he was the best and brightest of his generation as well as the ones before him. With all these glowing compliments you would assume that God would make things much easier for him. Right?

Not a chance, Jack! He gave him a massive job to do - save all mankind and all the land animals - and to watch the entire world go topsy-turvy in a cataclysmic global event! He had to build an ark that could hold them all, three levels up, with enough storage room for food and supplies. He also was tasked with the job of preaching righteousness to those that made up the culture of that day - a culture of people that the Bible describes like this: "... every intent of the thoughts of their heart was only evil continually" (Gen. 6:5). Try to start a church with this crowd! To this man that found "grace," he had an impossible life ahead of him! Imagine the job of being a pastor of a "San Franciscostyle" community and in your spare time build an ark 450 feet by 75 feet. And you thought you had it tough!

The focus here is on what Noah had that caused him to be the man God called out, the one God had the confidence to give a monumental assignment to, and the one that fulfilled this task without ever a word of complaint, second guessing, or compromise. Hebrews 11:7 nails it – "godly fear." This is that foundational characteristic that sets him apart. It's the linchpin that holds the other attributes and actions together and that made Noah the man he was.

Godly fear is deeper than just reverence. Godly fear is not being scared or worried, though it does have a level of awareness of God's awesome power and sovereign rule, and if accurately understood that can make you weak at the knees. It is the action of fear without the reaction of fear. Let me explain. The action causes us to respond to God's voice attentively and to obey immediately. The reaction causes us to crumble in dread, selfishly worrying only about our own safety. Noah was not worried that God would not protect him or be displeased with him because he had developed a consistent, meaningful relationship with Him. A relationship based on godly fear is one of deep respect and knowledge of God's perfect character and understands His ultimate intentions - to bring salvation to mankind. How we respond to God's presence and His instructions are an indication of our level of relationship. If it is built on godly fear, that relationship can do the impossible.




